The name of the Federation is St Augustine's Federated Schools

The names of the schools in the Federation are:

- St Augustine's Church of England High School
- St Augustine's Church of England Primary School

Both schools are voluntary aided schools. The name of the governing body is:

'The governing body of St Augustine's Federated Schools'

The governing body shall consist of:

- two elected parent governors
- one LA governor
- **one** staff governor
- one Head of St Augustine's Federated Schools (Ex-Officio)
- **three** co-opted governors
- ten foundation governors

Total number of governors: eighteen

St Augustine's Federated Schools foundation governors are appointed by the following bodies:

- four St Augustine's Parochial Church Council of St Augustine's, Kilburn
- two London Diocesan Board for Schools
- three by the Deanery of Paddington

The holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex-officio: The Vicar of St Augustine's Church

The Archdeacon of Charing Cross shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the ex-officio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that that ex-officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 23 (2) of the Regulations.

The Archdeacon of Charing Cross shall be entitled to request the governing body to remove the ex-officio governor referred to in 8a above and to appoint any substitute governor. A trust deed dated 1975 exists concerning St Augustine's CE High School. St Augustine's CE Primary School has a trust deed.

Ethos statement:

Recognising their historic foundation, the schools will preserve and develop their religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The schools aim to serve their community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian beliefs and practice. They encourage an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promote Christian values through the experience they offer to all pupils.









- The term of office of all governors will be 4 years.
- This instrument of government comes into effect on 28th October 2019
- This instrument was made by order of Westminster Local Authority on 23th October 2019.

A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body, any trustees and to the London Diocesan Board for Schools.
