Unspoken Histories
 A study of historical significance with an enquiry focus on what gets included in history. The topic looks at the histories of children, people with disabilities and LGBT+ history and why they are so often overlooked by nation histories

The Holocaust
 An in depth study covering several key areas.
 - The roots of antisemitism and causes of the Holocaust
 - The events of the Holocaust
 - A strong focus on the voices of survivors

The First World War
 A study in *causes* of the First World War. The enquiry starts by looking at the events at the outbreak of war including the assassination of Franz Ferdinand. The enquiry then looks at why the war ‘wasn’t over by Christmas’ looking at events such as digging in and the failure of the Schlieffen Plan

The British Empire in India
 A study of *consequences* of the British Empire by looking in depth at the British Empire in India. The enquiry has a particular focus on the end of the British Empire in India, Partition and migration

Suffragette Protest
 A study in depth using *sources* to understand the emergence and fight for female suffrage in the 20th century. The enquiry focuses on the reasons that women won the right to vote and which of these reasons contributed the most

 A local study of *change* over time
 Studying the movement of groups from the Neolithic period to the present day, including Celts, Anglo-Saxons, Middle Eastern, African and South Asia

Apartheid in South Africa
 A study of the *causes* and *consequences* of Apartheid in South Africa in the 20th century. The enquiry looks at how Apartheid came to be, what it was and it’s impacts on South Africans. The final part of the enquiry looks at how Apartheid came to an end and why
