


## 1. Attendance

98%-100%	Excellent attendance			
	Less than 4 days absence in an academic year			
95%-97%	Good attendance			
	Less than 9 days absence in an academic year – Nearly two weeks of school			
	missed			
90%	Below average and low attendance			
	19 days absence in an academic year – Nearly one month of school missed			
	Students with 90% attendance or below are classified as Persistently absent from			
	school and parents/carers of students with this level of attendance or below could			
	be issued with a Penalty Notice.			
85%	Exceptionally low attendance			
	29 days absence in an academic year – Nearly 6 weeks of school missed.			





What is the impact?



Pupils who did not achieve grade 9 to 4 in English and maths GCSEs in 2019 had an overall absence rate of 8.8% over the key stage

Among pupils with no missed sessions over KS4, 83.7% achieved grades 9 to 4 in English and maths compared to 35.6% of pupils who were persistently absent.


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#### 2. Punctuality to lessons

#### **Restorative Detentions (RD)**

 Tutors will automatically receive a list of those who have RD.

- Tutors escort students to the Main Hall.
- Teachers attend the hall to hold a restorative conversation with students



Class teacher adds negative behavior point. This automatically creates a detention.



RD is 30 minutes in the main hall

- 3 negatives is SLT on Friday

SLT will continue to run on a Friday.

If you get any negative's on a Friday and you have SLT then you will have to sit your detention and the SLT detention.


# Further support for our students

Support Sessions starting 1st October 2025



#### 1. Additional Regulation Centre (ARC)

- Students are not in lessons for a period of time
- They are provided work by their teachers
- Specialist member of staff speaks with students to help them understand why their behaviour has led them to be in ARC
- Specialist member of staff helps students to recognise what they must do better next time
- A letter is sent home to parents detailing why their child was placed in ARC



## 2. Learning Support Centre (LSC)



- Year Team suggests students who are struggling to regulate in lessons
- These students spend half a term with Mr Amlak in the LSC
- They focus on methods of regulation and completing work set by their classroom teachers
- Mr Amlak teaches the students strategies to help them regulate in lessons
- They then follow a phased reintegration plan and by the end of the half term students are back up to a full timetable



#### <u>Homework</u>



- The homework policy at St Augustine's is a two for one policy. Meaning that for every two lessons you child has in a subject they will receive one piece of homework.
- Most homework will be set on Microsoft Teams however some departments may use different apps to set homework.
- It is vital that students keep their passwords safe for all the applications and programmes that they use at St Augustine's.
- The library is available at lunch and afterschool for students to complete homework should they not have access to the internet at home.

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#### How can you help your child at home?

- ✓ Discuss their school day with them.
- ✓ Listen to them reading.
- ✓ Monitor their completion of homework.
- ✓ Encourage them to join in extracurricular clubs.
- ✓ Communicate and work with teachers to address any issues in school.
- ✓ Make sure your child gets enough sleep.
- ✓ Ensure that they are equipped and ready for school the night before (although this should be the student's responsibility.
- ✓ Most homework will be set on Microsoft Teams however some departments may use different apps to set homework.
- ✓ Monitor you child's social media account.

#### Year 9 Student Uniform Expectations:

It is an expectation that all students wear a shirt (tucked in), the school tie (done up) and their blazer must have a school badge.

If you misplace any of these, you will then have to pay for a replacement.



#### Student Lanyards!

#### All students now MUST wear their own personal lanyard at ALL times!


Students have been given a lanyard that they <u>must</u> keep around their neck at all times so that it is visible to staff.

- ➤ Students will need to show their ID card when they enter through the gate/reception in the morning
- > They will need this lanyard to pay for their school lunch
  - ➤ They will need this lanyard to access the toilets (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> floor)

If they are found in school without one you will be escorted to your year team.
